Abstract

The Griffis' Journal of Tokyo Years (1873 / 4 / 1 ~ 1874 / 9 / 17)

By William Elliot Griffis

This Griffis' Journal was written by W. E. Griffis (1843, 9, 17 ~ 1928, 2, 5) from April 1st, 1873 to September 17th, 1874. It is a continuation of the last issue.

W. E. Griffis came to Japan in Dec. 30 1870, after he had studied the new Scientific curriculum at Rutgers University in N.J. He was an American teacher (Yatoi) who had taught Japanese boys Chemistry and Physics etc. at Meishinkan (Fukuihan Hanko) and Nanko-Kaisei Gakko, the precursor of Tokyo Imperial University.

This Journal is the latter half of the journal which he wrote while he was staying in Tokyo. He tried to teach chemistry and physics to the Japanese students, especially that he had experimented on the blow-pipe analysis etc. with his students. He clashed with "Japanese Bureaucracy" about his contract. But he enjoyed his Japanese lives by walking, riding, and traveling with his familiar friends, students and Margaret Griffis, his sister.

It is very interesting for us to understand and know the Japanese life style and to know how the Japanese education modernized in early Meiji Japan from his Journal.

I tried to transcribe the Journal. I could find out more problems with words and punctuation. Letters like f, g, j, p, q, z can cause these problems. And he sometimes used the term "Jap" that was offensive and derogatory. When such a term is used, I want to indicate by using *sic* in blank like [*sic*].

Finally, I wish to express my appreciation to Prof. Ruth J. Simmons, who is a senior curator of the Griffis Collection of Rutgers Libraries helped and advised me about the Griffis' journals that I had not been able to read.

1. "Griffis' Journal (1873/4/1-1874/9/17)" のいくつかのトピック

本稿は "Griffis' Journal (1872/1/23-1873/3/25)" の続きである。(注1) すでに前稿の解説でお雇い外国人教師 W. E. Griffis 及び "Griffis'

Journal" について記しているのので、ここでは本稿で扱う1873年4月1日から1874年9月17日にJournal(日記)に記されたいくつかのトピックについて紹介しておきたい。

1) 学校と授業

グリフィスは来日当初から日本語の学習を進めてきた。平仮名・片仮名の学習はもとより、『南総里見八犬伝』『古事記』なども日本人から手ほどきを受け、学習を続けてきた。“Journal”のなかに所々に出てくる漢字の表記やローマ字表記の地名・人名の記述の変化に彼の日本語学習の進展ぶりが窺える。このことが実際の授業にどれほど影響したか興味のあるところである。

さて「江戸の大学」の「専門教師(Professor)」として契約を交わしたグリフィスであったので、何よりも授業の準備をしたり、実際に生徒・学生たちに授業をし、交流したときの記述は“Pleasant day at school, 1st, 2nd, 3rd classes.” (1873/4/5)のように生き生きしている。そして1873年5月31日に新校舎が立ち、新課程が始まった。グリフィスは6月14日から“the new lessons”をはじめた。この後“chemical work” (1873/6/21)といった記述が見られる。有機化学を取り上げるようになるとそれ以前よりも「授業の準備」という記述が増える。

また天皇臨幸 (1873/9/9)や皇后の行啓 (1873/11/27)、文部省役人の視察 (1873/10/6 - 10/9) 等の折に学生が化学実験の紹介をする機会が何度かあった。その準備の様子と周りの様子もよくわかる。

この間における大きな行事の一つは1873年10月9日の開成学校開業式への天皇の臨幸であったのではなかろうか。開成学校は日本で最初の「専門学校」という位置づけをもって一番中学から改称された。開業式は世間に広くその存在を知らしめる意味を持っていた。

「10月4日 (1873年—引用者) 太政官より文部省に向け、10月9日開業式挙行に就き 臨幸被仰出旨、達せられたり。此に於て本校は再び車駕を迎ふるの光栄を荷ふこととなれり。」(注3)

10月9日当日は次のようであったと『東京帝国大学五十年史』には記されてい

る。

「(明治天皇が) 便殿に御少憩の後式場に出御、玉座に着きたまふ。文部長官(文部大輔田中不二麿) 本校校則校舎図一卷及本校の鑰を奉呈す。此の時勅語を賜ふ。次で鑰を文部長官に下し賜ふ。文部長官総代として祝辞を奉り、終つて鑰を本校校長伴正順に與ふ。尋いで文部省学校督務ダビットモルレーが御雇外国教師総代として祝辞を奉れり。此れを以て式を終り、尋いで文部長官及本校校長の御先導に依り講堂(教室)に出御遊ばされ、左の諸学科を天覧あらせられたり。」(注4)

この時法学生徒齋藤修一郎をはじめ、理学、諸芸学、鉱業学、機械製作掛などそれぞれの学科が日頃の学習成果を披露した。グリフィスの担当する化学は長谷川芳之助、杉浦重剛、南部球吾が「化学ノ効用ヲ述」べた後に「灰精ヲ水上ニ燃ス」実験から「鉛糖ト重クロム酸灰精ヲ以テ白布ヲ黄色ニ染ム」などまで13の実験を行ったという。(注5)

この「臨幸」のための準備をグリフィスは10月3日から開始し、10月9日には“Perfect day. Mikado visited the new school.”と記す。“Griffis' Journal”は上記のような公式的な学校史の記述もグリフィスという一人の外国人教師の目を通して違った一面を見ることができる。皇后の行啓は1873年11月29日に開成学校と東京女学校に対してされた。(注6)

授業を熱心に行いながらも一方でグリフィスの気持ちが常に晴れていないことも注目される。契約内容のこと、給料のこと (1873/7/10)、契約更新の問題 (1873/9/15)、(1873/8/19) などについて文部省とのやり取りが記述されている。(注7)

2) 散歩・旅行と教会

グリフィスの日記を読むと彼が日本で心身共に健康的に仕事を継続していく上で毎日の散歩と週一回の教会の礼拝への出席、そして夏休みなどの長期の旅行が大事な意

味を持っていたことがわかる。

散歩は放課後同じ外国人教師の仲間たちと一緒に、上野や浅草、芝、築地などをしばしば訪れている。それは騎馬であったり、駕籠を使ったりその時々時間的な余裕や天候とも関連するかも知れない。(注8)

グリフィスは日課の散歩について後に次のように述べている。

「私は毎週次々にフルベッキ氏が仕事をこなすのを見ていたので、彼の生活の日課がわかっていた。フルベッキ氏は朝早く起き、朝食前に書き物をする。食後直ちに学校へ行き、午前中3時間と午後の3時間はこまごまと監督する。そして午後4時から6時まで、私が東京の町や郊外をあちこち探索するとき、しばしばフルベッキ氏は合流する。遠くに行くときは、私たちはよく馬で出かけた。人力車を使うことはなかった。1871年初頭には、人力車は横浜以外ではほとんど知られていなかったのだ。徒歩や馬で旅行する他によく使われる手段は駕籠、つまり竹でできたバスケットを木の棒に吊し、二人の男がかつぐもの。あるいは棒に釣り下げたものを4人の男が支える乗物である。馬車、つまり馬が引く乗物はまだ珍しかった。汽車や鉄道は依然夢のような話で、そのかすかな徴候さえなかった。私たちが町を歩き、1868年7月4日の戦いの場所である上野、あるいは浅草や芝に行ったときは、私たちの生命を守る、武装した護衛が同行してきた。」(注9)

ここでグリフィスが紹介した散歩は1872年1-2月の様子である。わずか2年足らずの間に「汽車や鉄道は依然夢のような話で、そのかすかな徴候さえなかった。」と記していた鉄道の開通をはじめ「文明開化」が急速に進展した様子もわかり興味深い。グリフィスにとって散歩は気晴らしや健康維持の目的もあったろうが、同僚の外国人教師らとの交流の時間であったり、関心のある「古刹」や神社を親しい友人や生徒・学生たちとたびたび訪れそこ

について調べたり、町の観察をしたりさまざまな意味があったと思われる。

グリフィスは来日当初から旅行をしているが、この期間にも7月19日から8月11日まで東海道・京都・金沢・福井への夏休みの旅行をした。福井では旧交を温め、たくさんの知人・友人と会っている様子も記されている。東海道はグリフィスにとって3度目であった。ほかに鎌倉・江ノ島方面や千葉・東金方面の旅行をしている。

こうした経験をもとに「東京ガイド」や「鎌倉ガイド」の出版に意欲を燃やした。また“Japan Herald” “Japan Gazette”など日本で発行されている刊行物やアメリカやイギリスで発行されているジャーナルへの執筆活動が計画的であったことを読み取ることができる。(注10)

日曜日の横浜の教会の礼拝への出席あるいは自分が主催するバイブルクラスで信者たちとの交流の記述は詳しい。例えば1873年9月20日に東京に“the first native Christian Church”が設立され、その教会の礼拝への出席者が日本人15人、外国人約18人 (about 18 foreigners) であったと記されている。横浜の教会行きは開通したばかりの鉄道を使っていた。(注11)

3) 天候・地震

日記には大抵の場合天候やその日の健康状態を記すのが常であろうが、グリフィスもその日の気分や天候を記している。それは“Good day in school.” (1873/4/8) のような記述もあるが、“Rainy day”, “Hot and dry weather during this week.”, “Lovely day.”, “Busy day,” “Glorious day”, “Splendid weather continues.”などさまざまな表現を使っている。地震や火事についての記述も頻繁にしている。(注12)

4) 最後に記した1874年9月17日はグリフィス31歳の誕生日であった。1871年28歳の誕生日ごろに日本行きを決意し、その年の暮れに来日したグリフィスが31歳の誕生日は故郷アメリカに戻って、パンプキンパイ

でお祝いをしたと記す。

2. 本資料の意義と今後の課題

- 1) 本稿が活字として起こされると1871年3月の福井藩明新館在職時代から1874年帰国するまでのグリフィスの日記の全容が分かることになる。(注13)「日記」は言うまでもなく筆者自身のために記すものであって公開することを前提には書かれていない。そのため脈絡がはっきりしなかったり、メモや覚え書きのような記述も多く、一日一日の記録を読んだだけでは評価は難しい。しかし例えば東京時代のグリフィスの行動から見た考えの変化を辿ろうとしたときに、この“Griffis' Journal”はその理解を助けてくれるだろう。

グリフィスが南校に着任してから「一番中学」、「開成学校」と名称変更をしたが、それは学科課程や教員の配置の変更にとどまることではなかった。そこで教えていた教師たちに制度改革がどのように受け止められたのか、またその周りでどのようなことが起こっていたのかなどをリアルタイムで見ることができるという点で大きな意味があると思われる。

- 2) 上述したトピックや前稿でふれた課題も含めて今後明らかにすべき課題は多い。

すでに開成学校におけるグリフィスの授業を取り上げたことがある(注14)が、日記の全体を読み通した上であらためて教育史と科学史の両面から南校—開成学校の研究に取り組みたい。その際グリフィスが日記に記した教師同士の豊かな交流も南校—開成学校の教育の解明にとって重要なファクターの一つとなるのではないかと予感される。

- 3) 最後にRobart S. Schwantes がグリフィスが福井という旧封建制度の土地と東京という新しい首都の両方で教えた希有の経験の持ち主であることに注目していることにふれておきたい。(注15)

確かに同じグリフィスの教育活動であっ

ても廃藩置県直前とはいえ旧藩の体制のもとで福井藩藩校明新館における教育活動と新体制のもとで新しい国家の担い手の育成をしようとする南校—開成学校における教育活動の目的は異なる。その違いにグリフィスがどれほど自覚的であったかはともかく、福井藩明新館の教師として期待された役割と南校—開成学校の教師として期待された役割は自ずと異なるのである。当時の文部省役人や開成学校校長らとの「衝突」(注16)の背景もこのような視点から改めて見てみたい。

こうした作業を経て、グリフィスの実践の全体像の把握と同時に大きく変化した制度の下での実践の意義を明らかにすることが必要であろう。(注17)

- 2) グリフィスは来日するときホフマンの「日本文典を買い求め、もっぱら薩摩と越前出身の私の友人や生徒から日本語の熟語を習」っていたと『日本のフルベッキ』(216頁)に記している。来日後のグリフィスにとって日本語学習の大きな支えはヘボン(Hepburn, James Curtis, 1815-1911)が日本語訳した4冊の福音書の手書き写本と1867年出版された辞書であった。(W.E.グリフィス著・高谷道男監修・佐々木晃訳『ヘボン 同時代人の見た』、136頁、150頁、教文館、1991,11)
- ちなみにヘボンは後に日本語を外国語に翻訳するときの難しさについて次のような興味深い発言をしていた。「その他に困難を感じたことは、道徳に関する言葉、貴金属、宝石類、パレスチナ地方の動植物を表す適当な日本語がないことであった。こういう場合、中国の書き言葉は言葉の宝庫だということに気がついた。権門におもねる飽くなき追従性を持つこの中国語を日本語に比較してみれば、日本語が本質的に言語学的であり、倫理性に富み、気持ちのいい言葉であることが理解されるであろう。」同上書『ヘボン 同時代人の見た』102頁

- 「男性が進歩すると同様に、女性も進歩しなければならない。この国のファースト・レディも、今や夫とともに新たな名誉を得る時が来た。昔と違い、妻として、一人の女性として、皇后が国家の新しい幅広い生活に参加する時が熟したのである。(中略)

1872年1月16日、皇居において、皇后はアメリカ公使とロシア公使の妻、デ・ロング夫人とビューツオフ夫人を接見した。このことは単に事実を述べるだけでは十分にいいあわせない意味を持っていた。というのは、皇后はこのことによって、客に名誉を与えた以上に自分自身に名誉を与えたのだ。京都時代には、ミカドの妻が夫と同等だとは、全く考えられていなかった。その地位にふさわしい称号で呼びかけられることはけっしてなく、ヨーロッパの同じ地位や肩書きの女性が受けるような栄誉を受けたことも絶えてなかった。(中略) 睦仁は妻に新しい権利を認めることによって西洋諸国の女性に享受されている自由が『天地ノ公道ニ基ク』ものであることを認めたのであった。」(W.E.グリフィス著・亀井俊介訳『ミカド 日本の内なる力』、岩波文庫、1995年、233-234頁、“The Mikado” 1915

- 12) グリフィスはヘボンの日記に毎日天候が記録されていたことの重要性を評価していた。「1880年から1895年までのヘボン博士の日記は、多くは書かれていないが、重要な意味を持っている。横浜に到着して以来の毎日の気温が記録されていて、貴重な資料である。私はこの気温観測記録を要約して、1876年の拙著『皇國』の初版本に付録として利用した。後に日本に气象台が設置され、毎日の天気予報をはじめ、台風の接近や地震観測に関しての情報が提供されはじめた時点で、博士の天候に関する記録は終わっている。しかし、博士の、自然の移り変わりに対する関心の深さは彼の日記によってうかがい知ることができる。例えば、泰山木、椿、桃、桜などの開花の時期についての記録もあり、花を見に出かけたことも記されている。」(前掲『ヘボン』155頁)グリフィスがヘボンの天候記録に関心を寄せたということは彼自身もその記録に意義を見いだしていたとみることができる。

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きの資料である。当然の事ながら日記は他人が読むことを前提しては書かれていない。旅の途中のメモのようなものから、幾分詳しい内容を含んだものまで日ごとに異なっている。それ故活字に起こす上で制約がいくつもある。以下の方針に従ってすすめた。

1) 紙の損傷やインクのにじみなどから判読不可能な箇所がある。それらについては()で記した。

2) 様々な状況で記された日記であるため、メモのような書き方をしている部分も多い。文法的にはあまり使われない用法であっても、本稿ではそのまま記した。

3) 日本の地名及び日本人名についてはGriffisの日本語習得の経過にもなって、変化してくる。そのため綴りは必ずしも一貫していない。[-K]とあるのはGriffisとゆかりのあるKatherineのメモを示す。また地名・人名に関してできるだけFushiyama, Fuzi (富士山) のように日本語を挿入した。外国人名については判明したものは(McCartee, Davie Bethune) のように記した。

4) また本文の中には今日の常識からすれば不適切な表現も含まれている。例えば“Jap”, “Japs” のように当時の差別的な意味を持って使われた用語もある。これらについてはJap [sic] のように表記した。又明らかな綴りや文法上の間違いもあるがそれらについても[sic] と表記した。

Dr. Griffis Japanese Record

Tuesday April 1st

Spent the morning at home, setting things to rights for another 3 months' work. Afternoon walk to the barbers' at Tsukiji (築地). Evening, began Japanese again. Scott called.

(Friday April 4-K atherine)

Capt. Watson called to bid us good-bye German. Terry (of the-K) -Saco U.S.S. called with him. Bought articles, and prepared, and to pack box for sending home.

Rise every morning at 6 A.M. study Japanese till 8 A.M.

Saturday (April 5th)

Pleasant day at school, 1st, 2nd, 3rd classes. Dr. Ritter called for chemicals etc. Afternoon, short walk—rain storm coming up—heavy rain.

Read newspapers and napped till tea-time.

Evening, studied Japanese. Miss Knipping called.

Sunday April 6th

Read one of Robertson's sermons to-day. Evening prayer-meeting at Dr. Veeder's. Afternoon, Mrs. Simpson, from Yokohama (横浜).

Monday April 7th

Holiday in honor of Zimmu Tenno (神武天皇). Rose at 5.30 studied Japanese till 8.

Mr. Chipman called. Walked 9-10 out with (MCG) around the castle. Camellias, cherry-blossoms, Fuji (富士山) all beautiful in their own beauty. Studied till 12 M. Corrected compositions 1.30-3.30. Walked out Yanagi-wara (柳原). Evening, wrote Gazette paragraphs 6.30-8. Began trip to Katsusa & Awa (上総・安房), wrote 8.30-10.

Tuesday April 8th 1873

Good day in school. Afternoon, walk to Uyeno (上野), which was crowded and gay. Evening, wrote usual. Mr. Randolph called, when we were out.

Wednesday April 9th 1873

Usual day in school. Marked out our garden. Walked

round the castle. Evening, Mr. Chipman, called and we discussed the enterprise which now filled his mind- the new newspaper for Yokohama (横浜).

Thursday April 10th 1873

Went down to Shiba (芝) to see Mr. Randolph rusu[sic]. Bade the folks farewell, as they will leave in a body at Monday night. Evening, Blanch Harper Baker, to stay with us a few days.

Good Friday April 11th 1873

Rose at 5.30, studied Japanese 6-8. Wrote on my piece "Inside Japan", 8-10. Walk 10-11.30. Afternoon, nap, walk. Corrected 3rd class compositions, evening wrote on piece.

Saturday April 12th 1873

Name of the college changed to-day to Kai Sei Gakko (開成学校). Spent an hour in the theatre at Tsukiji (築地) this afternoon. Evening, dinner, Mr. & Mrs. Verbeck, and Mr. & Mrs. Veeder with us.

Sunday April 13th 1873

Dr. Veeder preached to-day. Mr. Randolph at church, came home to tiffin with us, and Mr. Monroe was with us also, and spent the afternoon. Evening, prayer-meeting at Mr. Verbeck's.

Tuesday April 15th 1873

Rainy day, after a long spell of dry weather. Mr. Verbeck bade us all farewell to-day, and left for Yokohama. English steamer starts at 6 A.M. tomorrow.

Wednesday April 16th 1873

Severe jerky earthquakes 11.50 during the night 11 P.M. Very windy all day. Bar 29.40. Usual work, visited the girl school, evening, wrote paragraphs.

Thursday-Friday (April 18th)

Earthquake Friday night 11 P.M. Called on Mr. Randolph.

Saturday Rev. Dr. & Mrs. Brown with us over night. Mr. & Mrs. Mitchell & Mr. & Mrs. Müller with Scott

over night. Dr. Brown preached to-day. Went over to call on Pere Nicolai- out. Evening prayer-meeting at our house.

Monday April 22nd (21st-K)

Took 4 P.M. train for Yokohama (横浜), visited the S.S. "Japan" & Idaho, saw Capt. Watson & Mr. Wright (Wright, William Ball). Evening, took tea and sociable & farewell to Capt. Watson. Large company. Went on board Japan with a party, slept all night in the berth.

Tuesday April 22nd 1873

Spent from 5.30-7.30, talking with Capt. Freeman, who rowed me to the depot, took 8 A.M. train, at school as usual.

Friday April 25th 1873

Usual day of work. Walk to Shiba (芝). Prof. Randolph out. Many Satsuma men (薩摩) in two swords etc. met on the streets.

Sunday April 27th 1873

Church as usual. Mail arrived 7.30, after prayer-meeting, read till 11.30.

Monday April 28th

Earthquake, slight 3.20. & at 10.25.

Wednesday [April 30]

Rainy

Thursday May 1st

Lovely day. Rose at 6.30. Studied Japanese till 10 o'clock. Walked out to Asakusa (浅草), dined at a Japanese tea house, rode some distance on the Oshiu Kaido (奥州街道). After returning, was called on by Mr. Smedley & Mr. Ken

Friday May 2nd 1873

School begins now at 6.30. Finish at 12. Dinner. Reading 12-2. Japanese 2-4. Walked out with Dr. Veeder & McCartee (McCartee, Davie Bethune) to visit Nakamura (中村). Found him at home, pleasant visit. Evening, wrote.

Sunday May 4th

Mr. Thompson preached, took tiffin and spent the afternoon with Prof. Randolph. Evening, prayer-meeting at Dr. Veeder's. Large fire 12 M. in Hogo (本郷), Oiwake Cho (追分町). At 10.30 P.M. alarm sounded, castle near Mikado's palace on fire.

Monday (May 5th)

Awoke at 2, glare of fire very great, dressed, walked out to the scene, lurid, grand, soldiers & immense crowd. Slept till 6.30. No school. Fire at Yoko Hospital (横浜の病院). Visited the scenes of the fires. Studied Jap [sic.] till 12. Nap [sic], Jap. [sic] 2-4. Walk. Evening, wrote etc.

Tuesday May 6th 1873

Rode out to Mukojima (向島) with Prof. Randolph 2-5 P.M. Lovely day.

Wednesday May 7th 1873

Usual day in school. With Scott & M.C.G. visited the high tower overlooking there burned space on which the Mikado's palace etc. stood.

Thursday May 8th 1873

In school (trouble between Dr. McCartee & Hashi) usual study etc.

Friday May 9th 1873

After school, at 1 P.M. rode with Ideura (出浦清悟), to Old Prince's summer residence spent three hours in conversation etc.

Saturday May 10th

Took 4 P.M. train. Took for Yokohama (横浜). Called on the Davidsons. Took tea at "the home", meeting Miss Gutrie, Mr. & Mrs. Loomis, etc. Called also on Dr. S.R. Brown, Mr. Goble (Goble, Jonathan), Dr. Nathan Brown, and then went to Asiatic society. Com. Nelson read a paper on Tai-funs. Staid all night with Mr. Syle (Syle, Edward W), as pleasant as ever. Stopped to see Mrs. Ballagh and the baby. Met Mr. & Mrs. Stone (Stone, Willam Henry). Returned to Tokei (東京) in the 10 o'clock train. Evening prayer-meeting at my house. Asahi Iwakura (岩倉旭) called to-day.

Monday May 12th

Usual day in school. Afternoon walked to Asakusa

(浅草), bought photographs. Nakamura called.

Tuesday May 13th 1873

Went to Yokohama 1 P.M. train. Long talk with Mr. Howell. Mail steamer arrived. Evening read news, etc.

Thursday May 15th 1873

Busy day, 5 hrs. Afternoon, went to Yekoin (回向院), matsuri there and crowds present. Examined new lecture rooms and laboratory. Evening spent in drawing up plane etc. three students Hasegawa, Saito & Komura (長谷川芳之助、斎藤修一郎、小村寿太郎) recommended to go abroad to study.

Friday May 16th 1873

Usual day at school, afternoon walk around Castle, evening, wrote. Slight earthquake at 8.25 P.M.

Saturday May 17th 1873

Usual day at school. Walk out with Dr. & Mrs. McCartee.

Sunday May 18th 1873

Rev. Mr. Loomis preached to-day. With Chipman & Scott called on Yagimoto (柳本直太朗). Telegram from Bonnell. Stand by the Sabbath. Evening prayer-meeting at Dr. McCartee's.

Monday May 19th 1873

Rainy day. Mr. Randolph called in the afternoon. Evening Mr. Syle at tea, and with us all night.

Thursday (May 22-K)

Busy in spare moments in finishing up the mail. House cleaning going on.

Monday May 26th

Mail arrived this morning. Evening with a party, rode down to Shiba (芝).

Spent very pleasant, evening with the ladies there. Grand starry heavens, and fine ride home.

Tuesday

Saturday May 31st 1873

Hot and dry weather during the week. New school building progress. New program made out for the Law

& Science Schools. Mr. Syle up over Sunday. Called at Tsukiji (築地) and Shiba.

Sunday June 1st

Rev. E. W. Syle preached to-day. Many Japanese present. Communion. Evening prayer-meeting at our house.

Wednesday June 4th

Cool pleasant day. Afternoon, visited Mr. Boyerton's printing place. Evening, Mr. Megomi called. Called on Nakamura yesterday afternoon.

Friday June 6th

Went to Yokohama (横浜), called on Chipman, Disscall, took tea with Mrs. Syle, Mrs. Pryun's, Mr. De Long (De Long, Charles E), Mrs. Barker etc. Returned in 7 o'clock train with Mr. Poat.

Saturday June 7th

Walk out in afternoon to Yekoin temple (回向院), grand matsuri (祭り). Evening called around the compound. Mr. Schenk, Miss Knipping married to-day.

Sunday June 8th

Very rainy all day. Did not go out all day, except for a walk in the afternoon.

Monday June 9th

Lovely day. Races at the Kudan (九段). Prof. Randolph called. Walk with Scott over the new Nippon Bashi (日本橋). Evening, wrote on the Fox superstitions of Japan.

Tuesday June 10th

Holiday to-day in honor of the festivities at Sho Kon Sha (招魂社: 現在の靖国神社), in memory of the slain in the civil war. Afternoon, ride to Uyeno (上野).

Wednesday June 11th

Fine weather. Went to Yokohama (横浜) in 10 o'clock train. Dined at Mrs. Baker's. Called on Mrs. Prun, Mrs. W. Dougall, Mrs. Ballagh & Mrs. Stone. Returned in 5 o'clock train.

Thursday June 12th 1873

Earthquake at 9 P.M.

Fireworks at Kudan (九段).

Friday (13th-K)

Dr. & Mrs. Brown, Bapt. & Mrs. Mac Cray Meth & Bro Thompson called this afternoon, 3 P.M.

Saturday June 14th 1873

Holiday to-day, after giving out the new lessons. Took 9 A.M. train to Yokohama (横浜). Met Mr. Miller at Custom House, Rev. Dr. Maclay (Maclay, Robert Samuel), Dr. & Mrs. Antisell, Rev. Dr. & Mrs. Newman from Washington, Mr. Brooks, etc. Dined at the Club with Chipman. Took 3 P.M. train. Rode up with Mr. Thompson.

Sunday June 15th 1873

Rev. Dr. Newman preached to-day. Star spangled banner style. Mr. De Long, Capt. Bachelder Major Warfield, Mr. Jones. Dr. Newman, M.C.G. & I took dinner together at Capt. Bachelder's house. Theological discussion. Called to see Prof. Randolph. Evening, Prayer-meeting at Dr. McCartee's.

Monday June 16th 1873

Mr. & Mrs. Baker, Willie & Mr. Oliphant came up, as per engagement to-day at 11.30.

Tiffin and at 3 P.M. ride to Kami Ido (亀戸) and Hori Kiri (堀切). Returned at 7. Found Dr. & Mrs. Newman & Miss Nellie Kinsell waiting for us. Dinner at 8.30. Separated at 10. Full house. Dinner by the caterer. Dr. Legge called out.

Wednesday June 18th 1873

Visited Hakurankai Exhibition (博覧会), called on Mr. Uri (瓜生寅), just returned from Europe, called on Dr. Legge & Carothers. Spent the evening with Mr. & Mrs. Cartman.

Anti Sunday troubles Ichi Roku

Saturday June 21st

Incessant rain all day. Usual school work. Afternoon, chemical work. Evening wrote on Fox-myths of Japan.

Sunday June 22nd

French lower classes at school to-day. Dr. Brown preached a very good discourse in church. Took dinner

with us. Evening, prayer-meeting at Dr. Veeder's.

Tuesday June 24th

Rain all day. Rode to Shiba (芝), visited Randolph at Capt. Bachelders, [']s Thompson, etc.

Wednesday June 25th

Rain nearly all day. Evening, party at Mr. Boynton's Ten Geishas (芸者), dancing shamisen (三味線) etc. Came home in the rain.

Thursday June 26th

Usual work in school. Pay day. Long talk with Ideura (出浦清悟) relative to renewal of contract, scientific schools etc. Evening, walk to near Ichigome Go Mon.

Friday June 27th

Rain from 4 P.M. all night. Dutch ladies called to-day.

Saturday June 28th

Floods of rain all day. Cleared off at 6.30 P.M.

Monday June 30

Took 3 P.M. train to Yokohama (横浜) rode down with Scott, Weiller, & Mr. Black (Black, John Baddie). Met Miss Baird, & Prof. & Mrs. Murray at the Hotel Miss Youngman. Leiu & Mrs. Day. Staid all night at Mrs. Pruyne.

Tuesday July 1st

Called on Mr. Howell, shopping etc. met many friends etc. took 5 P.M. train returned with Miss Baird.

Wednesday July 2nd

Rain in the afternoon. Evening, walk to Sui Do Bashi (水道橋). Americans met together at Mr. Wilsons (Wilson, Horace E) to discuss about 4th of July celebration at 9.20 had an earthquake, which lasted 60 seconds, with about 10 seconds of secondary vibrations. Movement at 1st, N. & S., then E. & W.

Thursday July 3rd

Fireworks prohibited. Planted flag-pole. Afternoon, called at Shiba (芝), visited Atago Yama (愛宕山) and rode around the castle with Miss Baird.

Friday July 4th

Rose at 7.30, raised the American flag. After breakfast M.C.G. Miss Baird & I rode to Uyeno (上野), Asakusa (浅草), Riogoku (两国) etc., returning at 1 P.M. Mr. & Mrs. Ballagh and children called Wyckoff arrived from Fukui (福井) at 3 P.M. 335 miles in one week. Evening, saw fireworks at Scott's, retired at 11. Lovers at—.

Saturday July 5th

Morning- Mr. Wilson questioned etc. by police and school authorities. Afternoon, all of us before the Kanji (漢字). Evening Mr. Wyckoff and Miss Baird returned from Yokohama, and at 9.30, they were married by Rev. Dr. Veeder in presence of Dr. & Mrs. McCartee, Scott, Mr. & Mrs. Wilson, Mrs. Veeder & Mrs. Verbeck etc.

Sunday July 6th

Rev. Mr. Thompson preached to-day. Communion service. Evening, prayer-meeting at our house.

Monday July 7th

Usual school work. Mr. & Mrs. Wyckoff left for Yokohama (横浜). Letter from Clarkie.

Tuesday July 8th

Lovely weather. Rode to Ikegami (池上) to visit the groves, temples, monasteries etc. Very hot. Therm 86. Evening at Dr. McCartee's & Shenk's.

Wednesday July 9th

Usual day at school. Mail in to-day. Afternoon, read all the time. Evening, walk.

Thursday July 10th

After School, went to Director's room. Salary raised \$ 30 per month. Prof. Murray took dinner with us. Called with him on Dr. McCartee & Dr. Veeder. Rode with Prof. Murray to Kagayashiki (加賀屋敷), thence to R. Station. Church meeting at the chapel. Heavy thunderstorm from 6.45-7.30.

Friday, Saturday

Busy writing an article-paper villages of Japan.

Sunday July 13th

To church this morning. Rev. Dr. Veeder preached.

Strong wind prevailed sermon short. Windy all day. Rainbow at sun set. Evening at Mrs. Wilson.

Tuesday July 15th

Was notified to-day that my contract would not be renewed. Took 2 P.M. train for Yokohama (横浜). Called on Mrs. Baker, De Long, Dr. Brown. Returned in 6 P.M. train.

Wednesday, Thursday

Usual days of work, evening, wrote on "Paper-makers and paper-money of Japan" .

Friday July 18th

Long talk with Mr. Ban (伴 正順), relative to contract etc. Renewed my passport etc. at noon. Afternoon, busy in repairing to leave Tokei (東京) for my tours, via the Tokaido (東海道), Kioto (京都), Fukuwi (福井), Kanazawa (金沢) and Naka Sendo (中山道), to Tokei (東京). Left in the 5 o'clock train for Kanagawa (神奈川), M.C.G. & WEG, Yamada (山田). Rode to Totsuka (戸塚). In 2nd story room, hotel full. With heat, hard beds and fleas, little sleep. \$3.00

Saturday July 19th 1873

Rose at 4. Off at 4.30. Stopped at Fujisawa (藤沢) for breakfast, and to visit the temple & bonzerie[sic.] at the temple and shrine of Nichiren (日蓮).

Dined at Odawara (小田原), stopping an hour. Walked to Hakone (箱根), M.C.G. in Kago (駕籠). Lovely lake scenery, Fuji (富士山) clear. Many foreigners in the village. With oil paper and camphor, slept soundly, fleas at bay. Starlight. \$9.00.

Sunday July 20th

M.C.G. sleepless all night. Rose at 3 A.M. Breakfasted. Off at 4. Descended the mountain. Jin-riki-sha (人力車) to Yoshiwara (吉原). Telegraphed to Clarkie from Numadzu (沼津). Long ride to Shidzuoka (静岡). Arrived at 9.15. Fuji (富士山) under clouds all day. Supper, talk and to bed. Very hot, mosquitoes plenty, but slept soundly all night. \$ 8.00

Monday July 21st

Took our Sabbath to-day. Rose at 8.30. Talked, breakfasted. Walked over to the school. Sung hymns and had music on the melodeon for an hour or so.

Dinner. Afternoon, writing, reading etc.

Tuesday July 22nd

Rose at 4.15. Breakfasted, and off at 5.10. Rode all day through beautiful mountain scenery, over the pass where C. & I first met. Heard of Wyckoff on the way. Dined at Kanagawa (神奈川). Slept at Mitsuki.

Wednesday July 23rd

Up at 3 off at 4. Dined at Arai (新井), Slept at Fujikawa (富士川).

Thursday July 24th

Off at 5.30. Dined at Miya, by the sea. Took boat and after 5 hours sailing, arrived () at 市日四 [sic]. ("took 力車入 to") [sic].

Friday July 25th

Dined at Kamiyama. Afternoon, lovely mountain pass and through the silk tea district. Slept at Midzuguchi.

Saturday July 26th 1873

Sound sleep all night. Awake at 4.20. Off at 5.15. Good 力車入 [sic.] all day. Dined at Otsu (大津) -very large and flourishing town. Fearfully rough road to Saikio (西京). Sorry we did not take kago (駕籠). Entered the sacred city (Kyoto-k) at 2.10. Put up a hotel by the banks of the Kamogawa (鴨川). After resting awhile, went out, bought some maps, and made a "preliminary survey" of the city through "tera machi (寺町)" etc. Returning, took baths then, from the hotel verandah watched the gay and lively scenes on the river, below and above the long bridge.

(Griffis' picture) 304 miles from Tokio (東京) to Saikio (西京).

Sunday July 27th

Visited the Shogun's castle, Mikado's Residence (not admitted). Shimidzu (島津), Megane Bashi (眼鏡橋) etc. Evening, river as lively as usual. Temples etc.

Monday July 28th

Mimi-dzuku (ミミズク), temples etc. Shopping off at 4.30 P.M. Walked to Otsu (大津), lovely scenery etc. Hotels all full, but in the new semi-foreign hotel by the lake-side, found very good rooms and furniture.

Tuesday July 29th

Rose at 6. Went down to the lake, and took a swim. Wrote all the morning. Took steamer at 12.30. Very small, but fine views. Sat on deck. Storm of rain. Rock full of white herons. Evening 8.30, arrived at.

Wednesday July 30th

Spent two hours in Tsuruga (敦賀). Saw Murata (村田氏寿), Amori & Tomita (富田厚積). Spent the night at Imajo.

Thursday July 31st

In Fukuwi (福井) at 10.30. Afternoon walked around town. Old scenes revisited, Good sleep.

Friday Aug. 1st

Met many friends to-day. Evening, entertainment at the mountain tea-house. Off at 6.30. Slept at Komatsu (小松).

Saturday (Aug. 2nd)

Sunday 8 /3 Arrived in Kanazawa (金沢) at 9.30. Called on Dr. Sluys & wife. Stayed at the I-jin-kuan (異人館) all night.

Monday (Aug. 4 th)

Left Kanazawa (金沢) at 9.30. Arrived in Tokei (東京) Monday Aug.11th at 8 P.M. Sat up till 12 P.M. reading the mail.

Tuesday (Aug. 12 th)

Read the mail all day. Hot. Evening, called on the compound people.

Wednesday & Thursday (Aug. 13 / 14)

Spent quietly at home, reading the newspapers, writing notes, etc. Called on the people in the compound, and they on us. Uriu (瓜生寅), Mr. Bonnell, the four new Methodist missionaries called on us. Hot and windy.

Friday Aug.15th

Took 10 A.M. train for Yokohama (横浜). Visited the barber hair cut. Dined at the club with Mr. Chipman.

Talk with Brooke (Brooke, John Henry) of the Herald on Missionaries. Met Clark, visited the Herald Office, Theater (Stereopticon) and Rev. Mr. Miller, Mrs. Pruyn, Mrs. Barker, Ballagh's. Read the Minister's. Morning, as I rode back on the cars. Evening, finished Paper-makers and Paper-money of Japan.

Saturday Aug. 16th

Wrote this morning, neally finishing Jap [sic.]. Fox-Myth and letter to M.C.G. Two scholars called to see me. Read and napped in the afternoon. Evening, read the Post.

Sunday (Aug. 17th)

Rev. Dr. Newman preached on "The eternity of human character" to-day. Visited hospital, & Randolph.

Monday Aug. 18th

Up at 7.15. Wrote. No school to-day. Miss Crosby (Crosby, Juria Neilson) with us all day. Called on Mr. Mori (森) out. Examined the new buildings on the Main St. Evening, wrote.

Tuesday Aug. 19th

Prof. Murray came up to tiffin to-day to stay two weeks with us. Received letter from Tanaka (田中不二磨), Mon Bu Kiyō (文部卿), notifying contract not to be renewed. Evening, wrote.
(*田中不二磨はこの時文部卿ではなく、文部大輔であった。)

Wed. (Aug. 20th) Thurs. (Aug. 21th)

Busy writing letters etc. for mail. Slightly nervous with excitement etc. Finished mail at 10.40 P.M. Mrs. Capt. Hubbell at Mrs. Veeder's takes mail at 8 A.M. tomorrow.

Friday Aug. 22nd

Clark with us today. Evening at Mr. McCartee's. Afternoon Iwakura (岩倉) and Nakamura (中村).

Saturday Aug. 23rd

Visited Scott's School (東京師範学校) today, with Clarkie. Afternoon Mr. & Mrs. Baker called. Evening, at Mr. & Mrs. Wilson. Clarkie, all night at Veeder's.

Sunday Aug. 24th

Rev. Dr. Newman preach[ed] in the Chapel today. Good audience. Afternoon, mail having arrived, read all the afternoon and evening.

Monday Aug. 25th 1873

Took 2 P.M. train for Yokohama (横浜), called on Chipman, Howell & Syle. Rode up with Mrs. Capron.

Wednesday Aug. 27th 1873

Earthquake at 10 : 9 P.M. 55 seconds, from E to W.

Thursday Aug. 28th 1873

Rain all day. Floods in the afternoon and evening. Wrote.

Friday Aug. 29th

Rainy all day. By appointment, went to Shiba (芝) and took tiffin with Mrs. Capron, Mrs. and Mrs. Pruyn & Prof. Murray there. Visited the tombs of the Sho-gun (将軍). Called on Gen. and Mrs. Williams. Evening-rain.

Saturday Aug. 30th 1873

Changed study-talk to dining room. Afternoon napped ! Saw Mr. Jaudain, Blanche Harper up to spend Sunday. Evening, wrote.

Sunday Aug. 31st 1873

Rev. Dr. Veeder preached to-day. Evening, read Dixon's Japan.

Monday Sept. 1st

Rainy all day. Saito came at 8.30, staying till 10 o'clock, answering questions etc. Took dinner with me. Nap, walk, evening, writing.

Tuesday Sept. 2nd

Sultry & rainy without headachy within. Invited to Mrs. Baker's Croquet party at Yokohama (横浜). Couldn't go. Napped. Walk along the Tori (トリー) - shopping. Evening Prof. & Mrs. Murray, & Scott. Up till 12 P.M.

Wednesday Sept. 3rd

Usual day of work. Afternoon Nagataki of Shidzuoka (静岡のナガタキ) called. Indexed my scrap-book.

Thursday Sept. 4th
Lovely moonlight night.

Friday Sept. 5th

Took 2 P.M. train for Yokohama (横浜) called at many places. Secured Mr. Seward's () around the world. Returned by the 7 o'clock train to Tokei (東京).

Saturday (Sept. 6th)

Mail arrived 2 P.M. to-day. Prof. & Mrs. Murray left us to enter their own house.

Sunday (Sept. 7th)

At home till noon. Went with Honda (ホンダ) to Uyeno (上野). Called on Asahi [Iwakura-K: 岩倉旭].

Monday Sept. 8th 1873

Rainy evening, wrote paragraphs etc.

Tuesday Sept. 9th 1873

From 2 to 3 P.M. practiced Hasegawa, Nambu, oishi and Matsui in experiments for the Emperor's visit.

Afternoon, called on Prof. Randolph and Mr. Mori with whom I had a long and interesting talk. Evening—wrote.

Wednesday (Sept. 10th)

Afternoon walk toward Uyeno (上野). Evening Mrs. Wilson called. Wrote. Rainy. "Soap" for Higoman (肥後の男).

Thursday Sept. 11th

Rainy day. Evening letter to Iwakura (岩倉). Wrote on Buddhism.

Saturday (Sept. 13)

Took 2 P.M. train to Yokohama (横浜). Met Iwakura (岩倉), Shimadzu (島津) and Sugiura (杉浦) in the depot. In Yokohama (横浜), called at Mrs. Syles, Mr. & Mrs. Miller, Mr. Black, Mrs. Pruy'n's etc. Evening at Dr. Brown's.

Sunday Sept. 14th

Union Church, Dr. Brown preached. Lunch at Mr. Syle's. Called on Mr. De Long, long talk. Japanese Sunday School at Mrs. Pruy'n's. Rain all day. Took 7

o'clock train home.

Monday Sept. 15th

Afternoon, Read old copies of Japan Gazette. Called on Prof. & Mrs. Murray. Met Sugiura (杉浦). Grand matsuri at Kanda Mio Jin Tera (神田明神の祭り). Evening, studied Buddhism.

Tuesday Sept. 16th

Fine day. Afternoon—walk to Uyeno (上野). Evening, Sugiura (杉浦) to tea and renewal of old memories. Scott called. Evening—work. Earthquake at 8.15 about. Very slight.

Wednesday Sept. 17th

Holiday in honor of Zinmu Tenno (神武天皇). New shrine at Uyeno (上野) opened. Iyeyasu (家康) now a Kami (God-k) by order of the Mikado. Rose at 8 o'clock. With Hasegawa (長谷川) who staid to dinner, translated the descriptive pamphlet of the Asakusa temple (浅草寺) miracles. Afternoon, visited Uyeno (上野) and tombs with Prof. and Mrs. Murray. Met many friends there. Immense crowds of natives. Evening, work.

Thursday Sept. 18th

Woke up with a heavy cold. Rainy all day. Afternoon walk. Evening, wrote.

Friday Sept. 19th

Rain all day. Did not go to school to-day. Thompson called to invite us to the native church formation tomorrow. Afternoon, went to Yokohama (横浜). Called at several places. Long talk with Mr. Howell. Took 6 P.M. train up. Evening, wrote.

Saturday (Sept. 20th)

Rainy all day. At 2 P.M. attended the organization of the first native Christian church in Tokei (東京). 15 Japanese and about 18 foreigners-missionaries present. Called afterwards on Capt. Bachelder and Mr. Jones. Walked home. Evening wrote.

Sunday (Sept. 21st)

Rain all day. Rose at 9.30. Did not go out all day, except to take a walk in the afternoon. Evening, read.

Dr. Griffis Japanese Record

Monday (Sept. 22nd)

Raining heavily all day. Washington called P.P.C. Leaves in to-night's steamer for America. Finished mail. Evening, wrote. Mrs. Knipping called.

Wesday [*sic.*] (Tuesday Sept. 23-K)

Feirie rain storm, floods of rain, lively wind, fences down etc. Sun out at 5.45 P.M. People worshipped it. Evening wrote on Geog. of Japan. Ideura (出浦清悟) at dinner to-day. Clear evening.

School duties 9-11, and 1-2.30. From 11-12 A.M. with Ideura (出浦清悟), visited Jap. [sic] sake' shops (日本の酒屋), and eating house, testing saki (酒) and alcohol. Afternoon, rain and hail. Evening, at work on book.

Cold day. Accomplished nothing. Afternoon called at Shiba (芝) and the missionaries at Tsukiji (築地).

Monday April 20th 1874

Clear day. Work as usual. Evening, Wrote [sic] notes for Yoko papers. Chipman called. Long talk 9-10.30.

Tokei Tuesday April 21st

After school, sent off last corrected proofs of Guide Book of Yedo (江戸). Afternoon, with Clark, visited the Tokei (東京) prisons. Saw inside the prison, prisoners, execution grounds, swords, Evening short walk, prepared for mail. Wrote on prisons etc.

Tokei Wednesday April 22nd

Very windy and dusty to-day. 1-2.30 went down to Hakurankai (博覧会), and bought a collection of photographs. Oishi 2 1/2-4. Read Child History of Japan 1853-1874. Walk to Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷) and back. Evening, wrote, on my experiences in the prison-yard yesterday.

Thursday April 23rd

Rain all day. Hashi, Onna Dai Gaku (女大学) 7.30-8.30. School 8.30-11.30. Rev. Mr. Williamson & Principal Dyer visited College to day. Mrs.[Mr.-K] Hatakeyama back from Satsuma (薩摩). Dr. Treat of Peking called at 12.30. Pleasant call. Afternoon, Dr. Williamson called. Oishi 3.30-4.30. Walk 4.30-6. Wrote 7-11.

Afternoon, Oishi, Nankoku's (artist) wife. Walk out. Evening, thunder and lightning and rain. With Yamaoka, and Tosui on map of Japan 6.30-11.

Japanese band of music, several Japanese officials and ladies, many officers from the U.S.S.S. Saco and Hartford, numbers from Yokohama etc. Very brilliant dancing, supper etc. Heavy storm of rain at 4 P.M. came away at 7 P.M. Evening, wrote.

Friday May 1st 1874

Morning till 10.30 spent in putting papers etc. to rights. Called on Uchida the artist 10.30-11.30.

Afternoon, visited the exhibition at Sei Do (聖堂) of Manuscripts, paintings etc. Thence went to the house of Ozawa Nankoku (大澤南谷), seeing him at his work of painting etc. Went to Asakusa (浅草). Evening, wrote.

Saturday May 2nd 1874

Morning, finished an article on the social status of "The Japanese Merchant" for the first number of the Tokio Journal, to be out next Saturday, but windy. Afternoon, called on Mr. Black. Evening, Stout with us all night.

Sunday May 2nd (3-k) 1874

Morning lovely. Rev. Mr. Cochrane preached, Communion. Bible class as usual 8-9.30 A.M. Evening class.

Monday 3rd (4-k) 1874

Fine day. Afternoon called with M.C.G. on Gen. and Mrs. Williams, and Mrs. P[eshine-K] Smith, and Mrs. Yoshihara (Yone) [Akai-K]. Evening, Stereopticon at our house. E.W. Clark exhibitor. All M.C.G.'s girls and ladies of compound.

School work over, rode to Tsukiji (築地). Rev. David Thompson and Miss M. Parke married by Rev. Dr. Veeder in Union Church. Reception at the house next door. Very large company fine time. Mrs. Benton & Mr. Ballagh with us all night.

Friday May 8th 1874

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In College 8-12. Afternoon 3-6 at Nakamura's. Heavy rain all the morning. Evening spent over the Map of Japan with Tosui (今立吐醉) & map artist Yamaoka.

Saturday May 9th 1874

Hashi 7-8. School 9-12. Afternoon, went out to purchase a collection of Idols for the Fair for American home. Evening, wrote.

Sunday May 10th

Morning and day perfectly lovely. After Bible Class, walked to Church. Rev. Mr. Green preached. Afternoon, saw and read first copy of the "Tokei Journal". Walked up to Prof. Murray's, saw Prof. & Mrs. Grigsby. Evening, Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Miller & Mr. Cochran to tea. Evening, bible class.

Monday May 11th

Three hours in College. Evening, had to dinner. Murata, Sasaki Yonosuke, Dr. Hajimoto, Koide, Iwabuchi (岩淵龍太郎) and Ideura (出浦清悟). Spent a pleasant time till 8.30. Scott called. Walked up to Kudan (九段) and back 9.30-10.

Tuesday May 12th

In school 10-12. Afternoon packed box of idols for Mrs. P. Walk to Hongo & Uyeno (本郷・上野). Evening, wrote article for the Tokei Journal.

Wednesday May 13th 1874

Hashi. In College 9-12. Faculty-meeting 1.30-2.30. Afternoon, called on Rev. & Mrs. Wright, -out. Went to see Boynton, Gov. printing office, etc. Photo-lithograph etc. Evening, wrote.

Thursday May 14th

Holiday-Ascension day. Mail arrived, morning. Afternoon visited office of Tokei Journal. Gen. & Mrs. Capron called. Gen. offered me position as private secretary, \$2000 per annum, to go to Yezo (蝦夷) etc. Evening, wrote.

Fukui bible class at 8-9.30. At Church, Rev. Dr. Veeder preached. Afternoon, walk to Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷). Mr. Cochran to tea. Evening, Bible Class. Retired at 11.15.

Monday May 18th

In College 9-12. afternoon, class 1-2.30. Called on Mrs. D. Ashmead [sic] at Tokei Fu (東京府), and on Judge Bingham, Mrs. Soper, and Rev. Messrs. Blanchet and Cooper. Evening, wrote.

Tuesday May 19th

Begun work in earnest on Map of Tokio (東京). Morning and afternoon. Walk, west of Kudan (九段). Evening, article for Tokei Journal.

Wednesday May 20th

Raining. Felt very dull. Prepared for class 7-8.30. College 9-12. Got Mail. Ready. Afternoon, headache. With Nakamura 4-5.30. Evening, Tokio (東京) Map Work.

Thursday May 21st

Afternoon, Dr. R.S. Brown and Yung Wing called, chatted awhile, and we visited the Kai Sie Gakko (開成学校). Called with M.C.G. on Mrs. McCartee at Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷). Evening, finished mail-map work.

Sunday May 24th 1874

Lovely day. Morning Bible Class 8-9.15. At Church, Rev. Mr. Soper preached. Afternoon, nap and walk to Sho Kon Sha (招魂社). Evening, long talk with Saito.

Monday May 25th

Map work 7-8.30. Afternoon on map 12.30-4.30. Visited Hatakeyama (畠山義成), and dined with him. Walked home-moonlight. Evening-on map 9-11.

Tuesday May 26th

On map 6.30-10. School 10-12. Afternoon class, map, walk on Tori (トリー). Chat with Uji tea-seller (宇治のお茶屋). Evening, notes & map work.

Wednesday May 27th

At work on Map of Tokio (東京) all the afternoon, and evening, till 12 o'clock.

Map work 7-8.30. Rather dull and drowsy. Afternoon, mail arrived. Read till 4. Walk around the Kudan (九段). Evening, on Map 7-10.15.

Friday May 28th (29-K) 1874

\$ Map delivered per Hashi to engraver, this morning. School work 9-11, & 1-2.30. Afternoon, nap. Rain, walk round the Kudan (九段). Evening, made up mail by the Vasco Da Gama, and prepared for trip to Kamakura, Enoshima, Yokosuka (鎌倉・江ノ島・横須賀), etc.

Saturday May 30th 1874

Took 2 P.M. train to Kanagawa (神奈川). Kamakura (鎌倉) 6.30. Visited Hachiman (八幡). Moonlight evening.

Sunday May 31st

At Kamakura (鎌倉) till 4 P.M. Walked to

Enoshima (江ノ島), and around the island. Spent the night there.

Monday June 1st

School duties 9-11, 1-2.30. Dressed for En Rio Kan 42 persons present, 10 ladies, 6 German, 5 French, 2 English, 6 Americans, Japanese officers etc. Walk through the garden. Banquet 4.30-8 P.M. Home at 9. Splended social success of Hatakeyama (畠山). Wilson called in 9-10.30.

Thursday June 5th (4-K)

School 9-12. Afternoon, Miss Guthrie left. Mrs. Wilson & Chaplain Lewis called. With map-maker. Tosui (今立吐醉) & Jap.[*sic*] newspaper, notes for Gazette. Walk down in the City. Evening-Matsubara. Tokei Journal article, etc. Scott called. Retired at 12.

Friday June 6th (5-K)

At work on Guide 7-10.30. Walk and purchases-afternoon. Evening on Guide, 7.30-10.

Wednesday June 10th

Rose at 7. School 8-11.

Mrs. Capron, Dr. & Mrs. McCartee to tiffin. Walk. Evening-Guide.

Thursday June 12th (11-k)

Rose at seven. Refreshing rain after two weeks dry and dusty weather. Guide 7-9.

Very hot and sultry. Afternoon work on Guide. Tanabe & Iku to tea. Evening, Mrs. Wilson called,

Guide finished 12 P.M.

Tuesday June 16th

Took 9.30 train for Yokohama, with Tosui (今立吐醉). Saw printer, delivered M.S.S. of Yokohama Guide. Took tiffin on board the Hartford, inspected the ship etc. Had Tosui measured by Tailor. Took 4.30 steamer to Yokoska [sic 横須賀]. Arrived at 6.30. Visited tomb. All night in tea-house - noisy fleas.

Wednesday June 17th

Rose, studied Jelly fishes in water. Took 7 A.M. steamer. In Yokohama (横浜) at 9 A.M. Calls, business etc. Dined with Mr. Howell. Evening Asiatic Society. Took 10 P.M. train. Rode up with Mr. Aston. Prof. Summers & Grigsby & Dr. McCartee & Mr. Chipman. Home safe 11.30.

Thursday June 18th

School 9-11. Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Thompson to tea this evening. Bade Jennie and Gussie. Veeder good-bye as the leave for U.S.A. in Steamer, China, tomorrow.

Friday June 19th

Mrs. Wetmore died early this morning.

In school, preliminary examination of 1st L. & 1st S. classes. Prof. Murray called.

Afternoon hot and no air stirring. Took 5 P.M. train for Yokohama (横浜). Services in Union Church. Dr. Nathan Brown officiating. Took cup of tea at Mrs. Syle.

All the Tokio folks returned in 7.30. train. Wrote 9-12. For Tokei Journal.

Saturday June 20th

Rain all day. Mold on boots etc. Did not go to school. Afternoon, packed one large box of inferior wares, armor etc. Sent off book case to Dr. McCartee. Evening, wrote.

Sunday June 21st 1874

Rain all day. Afternoon walk to Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷). Morning Bible class.

Monday June 22nd

Rain. Examinations begun 1st Law Class. Statistic. Afternoon at work on map for Yokohama Guide. Went out towards Asakusa (浅草), with M.C.G. and Mrs.

Murray, bought \$29 worth porcelain ware & \$10 photographs. Evening, on map 7-10.

Tuesday June 23rd

Rain, but in smaller quantity. At work on map and guide. Evening, wrote.

Wednesday June 24th

Fine weather. Examinations. Wrote article for Tokei Journal. Afternoon, on map. Evening, Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Arthur to tea.

Thursday June 25th

Earthquake 6.25 A.M.

Examinations in Chemistry 8-11 A.M. Afternoon, packing. Calls on Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Wright & Dr. & Mrs. Beukama. Evening, Mr. Black Editor Gazette to tea, and spend the evening.

Friday June 26th 1874

Heavy rain all this morning. Warm. Afternoon walk[sic]. Evening[sic].

Saturday June 27th 1874

Fine day. Examination. Engravers brought corrected proofs of Map of Tokio (東京) at 6 P.M. Put into hands of printer-Izdumiya. Took dinner, and spent the evening at Gen. & Mrs. Williams. Mrs. Arnold, and Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Davidson present also. Fine time. Clark & I walked home by moonlight.

Sunday June 28th

Rain all Rev. Mr. Davidson of Nagasaki (長崎) preached. Evening & morning bible class.

Monday June 29th 1874

Morning, one hour in school. Afternoon, busy packing up for U.S.A. (5-7) Evening, walk in Tori (トーリ), buying curios, porcelain etc. Evening, called on Mr. Knipping, wrote.

Tuesday June 30th 1874

Very fine weather, but very hot. Busy at packing. With Mr. Knipping, visited German Asiatic Society Museum, at Shiba (芝). Rain 4.30-5. Evening, rode to Uyeno, thence to

Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷). Returning found. 50

Maps of Tokio (東京) finished.

Wednesday July 1st

Took 9.30 train for Yokohama (横浜). Delivered maps. Business calls etc. Read proofs of Guide. Took dinner at Mr. Cochrane's. Met Rev. Messrs Green & Loomis. Called at Pruyn's, and at Dr. Brown's, but Robt. & Mrs. Gordon Brown out. Took 6.15 train, riding up with Gen. Legendre & Minister Bringham.

Thursday July 2nd

Hot day. In school 2 hours. Afternoon, packing. Evening with Mr. & Mrs. Wilson. Wrote.

Friday July 3rd

Fine day. School 2 hours. Afternoon, class in laboratory 1 1/2 hr. Packing.

Ride to Shinbashi (新橋) and back. Mr. & Mrs. Arthur to tea. Walk on the Tori (トーリ) in evening gay and brilliant. Bought lanterns and candles for tomorrow, July 4.

Saturday July 4th

At noon, 36 American ladies and Gentlemen met around Scott and Weiller's board. Tiffin, songs, speeches, toasts 4 & 20 birds in a pie, etc. 12-4.

Afternoon, visited Asakusa with Mr. Stuart. Evening, Mr. Scott to tea. Six students called in Illumination etc.

Sunday July 5th

Communion at church to-day. Evening, opening of the Sumidagawa (隅田川).

Monday July 6th

Examination 1st tech. Class 11-12. Afternoon, Took notes on Nikko (日光). Mrs. Capron & Mrs. Murray, Mrs. Mc Dougal, Mr. Stout & Hathaway of Hartford, called. Students called to make presents. Kawakami (河上), Takahashi, & Nishikawa to tea. Evening with students in their rooms. Scott called. Read proofs of Yokohama Guide pp.25-32.

Uchida - photograph. (内田写真館) Afternoon at Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷). Oiwa (大岩) from Fukui (福井), evening. Heavy rain all day. Took names of 1st Tech. class.

Thursday July 9th

Dr. Talmages family 2 daughter, son & Mr. B[allagh-K] up to-day. Tiffin. Evening Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Wright & Mr. T[almage-K] to tea. Mr. Chipman called.

Saturday July 11th

Wyckoff arrived this A.M. from Fukui with letters etc. Mrs. W. in Yokohama (横浜). Visited the Shi Han Gakko (師範学校), and Prof. Summers. Afternoon, Church meeting 4 P.M. Called on Bro. Thompson. Evening, Mr. & Mrs. Peshine Smith called.

Sunday July 12th

Lovely day. Church full. Dr. Talmage preached. Afternoon, at Kaga Yashiki (加賀屋敷) - farewell. Evening, Bible Class. Kuhara (久原), Ibi (衣斐弦太郎後に関谷清景), Iriye (入江邑次郎後に穂積陳重), Saito (斎藤修一郎), Miura (三浦和夫後に鳩山). Rev. Mr. & Mrs. Wright & Mr. Shaw called. Comet.

Monday (July 13th)

Busy from 7.30-11.30. At Uchida (内田写真館), taking photographs with students. Six classes in all. Faculty meeting A.M. Afternoon, busy in packing up.

Evening, dinner. Gen. & Mrs. Williams, Mr. & Mrs. Wilson, Mr. Scott, & ourselves. From Sei Yo Ken. Packed till 12 P.M.

Tuesday July 14th

Took 12 M. train for Yokohama (横浜). Secured passage, business etc. Took return train 5 P.M. Dinner at Hatakeyama's 7-11. Mr. & Mrs. Tanaka & Kuki (九鬼) E.W.C., W.E.G. & M.C.G.

Wednesday July 15th

Packed up. Shipped off seven boxes. Many Callers, etc.

Thursday July 16th

Lovely day.

Morning, busy packing. At 12 M. went to Iwakura's mansion to breakfast Prof. Murray, Grigsby, Clark, Dr. Verbeck & Asahi & Hatakeyama, & Iwakura pale and feeble. At 5 P.M. met the Mei Roku Sha (明六社), discussed & dined. Spent a few minutes at Okubo's house. Lovely sunset, then at Kastu's house, talking history till 10 P.M. Starry night, busy till 1 A.M.

Friday July 17th 1874

Busy packing etc. all day. Evening, took dinner with Mrs. Wilson; and at school, was presented with a cabinet testimonials etc. from Hatakeyama (畠山). Up till 12.45.

Saturday (July 18-k)

Up early, took 8.15 train for Yokohama. Busy all day, winding up affairs, etc.

Evening, tea at Mrs. Pruyn's calls on Mr. & Mrs. Store, Miller, Hepburn, Syle etc. Took sampan, and on Colorado at 10.15. Many friends on ship to see us off. Up till 12.45. Night dark, phosphorescence splendid, lights in harbor beautiful.

Sunday July 19th

Loading tea all night. Steam up and off at 6 A.M. Sky cloudy, and Fuji (富士山) not visible. Down the bay, past Cape King and due east from Osima. Read etc. all day. 20 Days at Sea Off the Farallone islands at midnight Aug. 1st. Put to sea again. Foggy

Saturday Aug. 8th

Signs of land, jelly-fish, birds, ships, etc. Took pilot. In the bay and saw land at 8:30. Landed 2:30 P.M. In San Francisco till Wed. afternoon. Spent Wednesday [12 Aug., 1874-K] night at Napa, two hours at Sacramento, with Mr. Upson.

Monday [Aug. 17-K] afternoon at Omaha. Tuesday afternoon at Chicago. Wednesday night at Suspension Bridge. Thursday [Aug.20-K] night at Albany. Friday night at Poughkeepsie. Saturday night spent in seeing relations.

In New York on Wednesday. Friday (Thursday Aug.27-K) night at Locust Valley with John Hart. Friday night with () at Great Neck.

Sunday—Cleveland's.

Monday (Aug.31th). Morning, wrote etc. Afternoon, Y.M.C.A. rooms, called on Dr. Ferris. World office, etc. Evening, planned lectures, and rode down to World office. Walked Back. Retired 11P.M.

Tuesday (Sep.1st-K)

Spent the evening and all night- with V. B. Carroll.

Thursday (Sept.3rd-K) Spent the evening with Mr.& Mrs. Slade—Jersey City. Rode over to Brooklyn with Miss Gardiner.

Friday (Sep.4th-K)

Busy on geographical work, letters etc. Afternoon on the Daimio's life. Evening—work Letters Overland.

Saturday Sept.5th

Rose late. Wrote an editorial for the World. Walked down town, met Labaut. Engagements.

Sunday Sept. 6th

Rose at 7:30. Went to Brooklyn. Dr. Buddington's Church. Waited 12-1 for Mrs. Clark. Took dinner at Mrs. Wyckoff, talked all the afternoon with Mrs. Clark. Tea at Mrs. W. Crossed over, and attended Dr. Kogir's Church.

Monday Sept. 7th 1874 Letter MCG.

Received telegram at 6:15 A.M. arrival of the Colon.

Met Tosui (今立吐醉) and Takato at Canal St. Wharf. Walk on Broadway etc. Afternoon, took 5 P.M. train for Jamaica and stayed all night with Van Slyke.

Tuesday Sept. 8th

Rose at 5:30, took 6:15 train for New York. Good refreshing air etc. At my desk 8:15. Wrote on ().

Wednesday Sept. 9th

Wrote chap, as above. Afternoon, had "Kojiki" (古事記) read. Evening walk etc.

Thursday Sept. 10th

Chap. On "The Dawn of History" . Jones came in towards 11A.M. Went out, dined together, and spent the afternoon. Evening, letters, map work etc. Night very warm.

Friday Sept.11th

Morning—map work. Called on Mr. Wind. Note from Appleton, more work for Cyc. Evening, Web. Dict. Work.

Sat. (Sept. 12th)

Returned Thursday, Sept. 17th —31 years old (Griffis' Birthday). Heavy rain all day. Evening, went over to Mrs. Cleveland's, celebrated my 31st birthday, on pumpkin pie etc.
